

Today's featured personage is Ebed-Melech ("King's Assistant"), a technically unnamed Ethiopian who would have been a member of the royal court or ambassador of the Candace, queen of Ethiopia. He witnessed an incident in which some of King Zedekiah's closest advisers cast the prophet into a cistern for having spoken against the royal government. Ebed-Melech reported the incident to the King who assigned three guardsmen to accompany him and rescue Jeremiah (38:7-13). ³⁵ Someone will ask, “How are the dead raised? With what kind of body do they come?” ³⁶ Fool! What you sow does not come to life unless it dies. ³⁷ And as for what you sow, you do not sow the body that is to be, but a bare seed, perhaps of wheat or of some other grain. ³⁸ But God gives it a body as God has chosen, and to each kind of seed its own body.

⁴² So it is with the resurrection of the dead. What is sown is perishable, what is raised is imperishable. ⁴³ It is sown in dishonor, it is raised in glory. It is sown in weakness, it is raised in power. ⁴⁴ It is sown a physical body, it is raised a spiritual body. If there is a physical body, there is also a spiritual body.

⁴⁵ Thus it is written, “The first human, Adam, became a living being”; the last Adam became a life-giving spirit. ⁴⁶ So it was not the spiritual that came first, but the physical, and then the spiritual. ⁴⁷ The first human was from the earth, one made of dust; the second human is from heaven. ⁴⁸ As was the man of dust, so are those who are of the dust; and as is the human from heaven, so are those who are from heaven. ⁴⁹ Just as we have borne the image of the human made of dust, we will also bear the image of the human from heaven.

⁵⁰ What I am saying, brothers and sisters, is this: flesh and blood cannot inherit the realm of God, nor does the perishable inherit the imperishable.

Joan will be speaking about America's second president, John Adams: *"From Puritan to Unitarian: The Religious Journey of John Adams."* Learn about this interesting man who described himself as "a church going animal."

Adult Education Events

"Racial Discrimination Embedded in Law and Custom"

The session will be designed to increase our awareness, recognize progress that has been made to change historic wrongs, and areas in which progress awaits. We will meet after worship in the Kishlar Room or on Zoom (<http://bit.ly/JehovahJava>). If coffee fellowship has resumed, bring you coffee and gather about 11:20.

Our presenter will be Rob Good. Rob is a retired high school social studies teacher and an adjunct professor at the University of Missouri—St. Louis. In his 27-year career as a high school teacher Rob focused on issues of equity and inclusion in both the curriculum and the policies and practices of the Ladue school community. He has facilitated diversity workshops and dialogue groups for a wide variety of organizations including the National Conference for Community and Justice—St. Louis, the Episcopal Diocese of Missouri, the YWCA's Witnessing Whiteness and Focus St. Louis. He has also served on the staff of NCCJ St. Louis' Anytown Youth Leadership Institute, the Dismantling Racism Institute, and the Inclusion Institute for Educators.

Wednesday, February 23

SAGE will host an afternoon viewing of an address by Heather Cox Richardson

"Telling the Story of America in UnSettled Times"

Professor Richardson is speaking to a conference of Missouri history educators. She speaks about the 1619 Project and Critical Race Theory, exploring why they have become polarizing topics. She clarifies the realities of classroom instruction on topics revolving around race. Professor Richardson teaches nineteenth-century American history at Boston College. She is the author of the popular daily newsletter, *Letters from an American* (<https://heathercoxrichardson.substack.com/>), which explores the history behind today's politics. Her early work focused on the transformation of political ideology from the Civil War to the presidency of Theodore Roosevelt. Her history of the Republican Party, *To Make Men Free* (2014) examines the fundamental tensions in American politics from the time of the Northwest Ordinance to the present.

Viewing of her address will be followed by conversation about the issues raised and perspectives obtained. This gathering will be at 2:00 in the Inglis Room and on Zoom (<http://bit.ly/JehovahJava>).

Sunday, February 27

"Movement Toward a Balanced History Curriculum"

Become aware of changes made in writing about and teaching U. S. History in response to the need for diversity, equity and inclusion in telling our story. Specifically, learn about the Social Studies (History) curriculum adopted by the Webster Groves schools. This session will help you develop an understanding of how the teaching of history has changed since our youth. Joan Musbach will provide information on these topics and facilitate discussion about issues raised. We will meet after worship in the Kishlar Room and on Zoom (<http://bit.ly/JehovahJava>).
