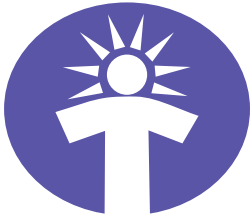

**We Lift Our Joys and Concerns*

Invitation (Responsive – Minister; **People)*

Beloved in Christ, the Gospel tells us that on the first day of the week Jesus Christ was raised from death, appeared to Mary Magdalene, on that same day sat at the table with two disciples, and was made known to them in the breaking of the bread.

This is the joyful feast of the people of God. Men and women, youth and children, come from the east and the west, from the north and the south, and gather about Christ's table.

Lighting Memorial Candles and Receiving Communion

Instructions

Maintaining safe social distance (at least 3 feet) and at the indication of an usher, please approach the altar from the diagonal aisle nearest your seat in order to light a candle of remembrance. Placement of candles begins at the back of the box (nearest the pulpit) so that later worshipers are not burned.

*Afterward, please go to the center aisle and partake of bread and either wine or juice (**Bread is gluten free; grape juice is red, wine is white.**) After you have received the elements and placed the emptied cups in the adjacent basket, proceed down the center aisle to return to your seat.*

**Prayer after Communion (Unison)*

Almighty God, we give you thanks for the gift of our Savior's presence in the simplicity and splendor of this holy meal. Unite us with all who are fed by Christ's body and blood that we may faithfully proclaim the good news of your love and that your universal church may be a rainbow of hope in an uncertain world; through Jesus Christ our Redeemer. Amen.
