

#### FROM THE PASTOR

What's Old Is New Again

How very good and pleasant it is when kindred dwell together in unity... It is like the dew of Hermon which falls on the mountains of Zion.

(Psalm 155:1)

Maybe I should have started with that old saying from Ecclesiastes 1:9 – "There is nothing new under the sun." You are reading this article, either by holding it in your hand or reading it from a screen. It isn't that you haven't done this sort of thing before; we're just taking an old form of communication and renewing it (again?).

The *Covenant News*, which has served since 2004 as a monthly newsletter, is now a weekly! It will be coming as a midweek electronic newsletter and on Sunday mornings as part of the bulletin, but without the graphics.

A little history might be helpful. Prior to 2004 the *Covenant News* was a semimonthly newsletter in a printed form, always produced with a typewriter using stencils that could be run on a mimeograph machine (for those of you under a certain age, that

clause will require some research). Before being named *Covenant News*, it was the semi-monthly *Churchman* (1967-1990). Prior to that it was the weekly *A Word* (1963-1965), monthly *The Reminder* (1931-1963), weekly *The Bulletin* (1898-1930, which was the only published news in Webster Groves for many of those years), and the original weekly *Webster Groves Congregational*

Trumpet (1897).

The *Trumpet* newsletter began when the Rev. Dr. Charles L. Kloss, who was pastor at the time, decided to add some entertainment to the morning worship order, quoting himself from past sermons and others whose words he'd read. It also included news and announcements about church events and officers' reports. This served as something of a wraparound to the order of worship.

It wasn't until *The Reminder* began to be published, as the Rev. Dr. George M. Gibson began his pastorate, that the newsletter would come in the midweek mail, the self-referencing quotes being notably set aside (Dr. Gibson preferred to publish his sermons complete, as pamphlets not as excerpts.).

So, we're kind of back to our own beginnings as an informed community. You'll be receiving news and updates midweek and on Sunday, as well as reports from staff and officers on a rotating schedule through the month.

This is how "kindred dwell together in unity," nothing new under the sun.

  <u>Liturgist</u>: Andrea Welnick. <u>Soloist</u>: Martin Mills (*You'll Never Walk Alone*).

  <u>Readings</u>: Romans 12:9-21 and Matthew 16:21-28. These readings both focus on the importance of letting God do what God does, even if we don't care for it very much (consider Romans 12:19 and Matthew 16:27). "*Leave Room for the Spirit*" is the title of the message of the day.
- September 10 Faith Formation Sunday. <u>Liturgist</u> Rebecca Novak offers a Story Before God. <u>Music</u>: The Choirs return! <u>Readings</u>: Ezekiel 33:7-11; Matthew 18:15-20. <u>Message</u>: "**To Save Yourself**." Is there any point in drawing another's attention to their questionable behavior? Didn't Jesus say something about logs and splinters? Yet, here he (and Ezekiel) offer processes by which to confront those who do us wrong... With a special ritual to bless Kids Church young people, staff, and volunteers, we acknowledge the contributions of all of them to the life of our Congregation. After worship, enjoy our annual **Autumn Potluck** (fried chicken provided; please plan to bring a side dish or a dessert).
- September 17 —New Members Received; Jazz Worship. <u>Liturgist</u> Nancy Rudolph offers a Story Before God. <u>Music</u> by the Oîkos Ensemble. <u>Readings</u>: Genesis 50:15-21; Matthew 18:21-35. Fresh from Jesus' instruction about how to handle a disagreement with another church member, Peter now challenges the lesson by asking about the limits of forgiveness: *How many times shall I forgive?* The rabbi's response surely seemed as ridiculous to Peter as the previous guidance. <u>Message</u>: "*Limitlessness*."

This afternoon at 3PM, contemporary Christian singer-songwriter **Vanessa Kersting performs in concert**!

September 24 – The UCC observes American Indian Ministry and United Samoan Ministries Sunday. <u>Liturgist</u>: Joan Musbach. <u>Readings</u>: Philippians 1:21-26; Matthew 20:1-16. There is something of a narrative arc to the passages we have been following, the past two Sundays, which has been pointing here. September 10, the conclusion was something like "Well, at least you tried." Last Sunday, it was "So, keep trying." Now, we're led back to the conclusion we noted on September 3: "Still, God will be the one in charge." But who else ought to be? <u>Message</u>: "**Acceptance and Embrace in the Kin-dom of God**"
