Today we gladly welcome *Klezundheit!* – the only klezmer big band in Missouri. It was founded by bandleader Bob Herman in 1998. Klezmer is a mostly instrumental music in the Eastern European Jewish tradition, designed for joyous ritual and dance. *Klezundheit!* played for the *Simchas Torah* celebration, yesterday, at Central Reform Congregation, and stayed together for one more day, to rejoice with us. *Simchas Torah* is the annual celebration of the rewinding of the Torah scroll in Jewish congregations. We join them today, in affirming the majesty of God's word and promise.

Last Sunday was World Communion Sunday, which we celebrated outdoors. As a result, some may have missed the **beautiful paper cutout** overhanging the sanctuary today. It was created in 2008 as part of a Worship Renewal Project funded by the Calvin Institute of Christian Worship of Grand Rapids, Michigan. The project, designed by Ellen Cavendish Phillips, is added annually to our sanctuary, for the first Sunday in October, and portrays many expressions of God's wondrous creation – wheat, grapevines, as well as bread and chalice. All the cutting or the twenty separate pieces was done by hand by members of First Congregational and St. John the Beloved Community UCC, which has a four-panel version displayed in its sanctuary.

Adult Education – Sunday, October 22 — "Peace Place Plans" after worship in Memorial Hall

Our next Adult Education session will focus on Peace Place, a proposed effort to develop affordable housing for seniors in the heart of Webster Groves. Peace United Church of Christ is working with the Housing Authority of St. Louis County to convert 204 E. Lockwood Ave. into Peace Place. (The church recently moved from that address to the campus of Eden Theological Seminary.)

Pastor Wendy Bruner and a member of the Peace UCC Governing Body will explain:

- how they decided to take on this project rather than just selling their prior home;
- the steps they're following to develop their plans, find partners, and get approvals;
- the architectural renderings of what the new facility will look like;
- what they have learned about affordable housing in Webster Groves (and beyond); and

• how their project might inform and facilitate more affordable housing efforts in Webster Groves. There will be plenty of opportunity for attendees to ask questions and to find out how they could help the development of additional affordable housing in our City.
