

race is truly at the center of everything for us humans. Grace shapes our faith, our family, our friendships, and our identity. Grace is not just being given the benefit of the doubt, or God bestowing favor on the less than worthy. Grace is also the root of gratitude and thankfulness. It is at the heart of our thanksgiving/eucharistic meal. "Grace upon grace" is a reminder of the great gifts of God to us, and an expression of our grateful response to that fullness.

Your gifts to the Christmas Fund allow the United Church Board for Ministerial Assistance to provide grace, hope, and joy through financial relief to UCC pastors, lay church leaders, and their families. Thanks to you, no request goes unfulfilled. Your graceful response to the Christmas Fund appeal ensures the flow of loving support will not be interrupted.

In 2022, gifts to the Christmas Fund enabled:

- Monthly pension supplementation for 218 retired clergy and lay employees (\$1,042,726)
- Health benefits supplementation for 86 retired clergy and lay employees (\$181,389)
- Emergency grants for 55 individuals and families (\$138,022)
- Christmas "Thank You" gift checks to 479 retired clergy and lay employees (\$278,500)

FROM THE PASTOR

"Carols and My Inner Scrooge"

What has come into being in the Word was life, and the life was the light of all people. The light shines in the darkness, and the darkness did not overcome it. John 1:3b-5

Our season of preparation is upon us – Advent. It is a time which, since my childhood, I have used to keep myself patient for Christmas. Now that I've gone spinning around the sun for more than 60 years, keeping myself patient in Advent seems to have more to do with subduing my inner Scrooge.

I admit, that part of me is patiently for Christmas *to be past*. The bills, the unrealistic expectations, the hyperbole (yes, even in worship), and the bills (sigh) have made patience a matter of toughening my heart.

Furthermore, we will say, "Unto us a child is born, unto us a baby given..." and yet, in a few short months, we will be remembering how he was killed – killed for our sakes, yes, but the gruesomeness is unsettling. That portion we so rarely sing, of the carol *What Child Is This*, nudges my curmudgeonly heart:

Nails, spear shall pierce him through, The cross be born, for me, for you. Hail, hail the Word made flesh – The babe, the son of Mary!

We're not thinking about this when we sing with one another, "Ding-dong! Merrily on high the Christmas bells are ringing!" I, at least, am using my *Hear comes Christmas*! Advent to slip past my inner Scrooge and its *Bah! Humbug!* Christmas.

How shall my heart be resolved? That's going to require some spiritual realism!

Two of my colleagues in the two days that I have been composing this article have chosen (unprompted, I should add) to remind me of how, when we imagine the birth of the Christ, we imagine it in a veil of darkness.

This is not a bad thing, they've told me. One referred to the darkness of night in which we may be surprised even to find stars shining. The other spoke about the darkness of the womb and the shock of the light to our eyes when we are born. Furthermore, "The world feels dim," she said, quoting Cole Arthur Riley¹, "but we dream in the dark."

I'm working now on getting my two kinds of patience – one favoring the Advent of Christmas and the other the Advent of post-Christmas – to respect each other. After all, they intersect, don't they! So, I'm singing contradicting Christmas carols and letting my inner child give my inner Scrooge a hug.

- DECEMBER 24, 10:00AM FOURTH SUNDAY OF ADVENT; A SERVICE OF NINE LESSONS AND CAROLS; CHRISTMAS FUND SPECIAL OFFERING. <u>Liturgist</u>: Andrea Welnick. <u>At the Advent Wreath</u> (Love): Hensley/Gomez Family. This very special service incorporates voices and instruments performing readings and music that may be familiar or new, to celebrate of the birth of the Messiah and the mystery of the Incarnation. *This service will be followed with our Christmas Wassail Bowl reception.*
- SATURDAY, DECEMBER 24, 4:30 PM FAMILY CHRISTMAS EVE. This brief worship service features many of the readings you'll have heard in the morning but with a Live Nativity tableau! *"Gifts for the Manger"* will be collected – infant and family needs to be presented to local charities, along with cash offerings. Singing of "Silent Night" ends the service, with battery-powered candles for the children to hold.

There will be <u>no services</u> conducted at First Church after the Family Christmas Eve, or on Christmas Day, Sunday, December 25.

SUNDAY, DECEMBER 31 – NEW YEAR'S EVE; SIXTH DAY OF KWANZA'A – KU'UMBA (CREATIVITY); HOLY NAME OF JESUS; ALL AGES WORSHIP. <u>Scriptures</u>: Ecclesiastes 3:1-13; Luke 2:22-40. This allages worship service, conducted in Memorial Hall, includes a recognition of the communitarian values of the season of Kwanza'a by Rev. Elston McCowan and a communitarian sermon by worshipers at the Pastor's prompting. This will be a fun and spirited ending to 2023!
