WORSHIP NOTES

This schedule is subject to change, as need may arise.
All worship services noted below will be offered in person and live streamed (bit.ly/FCCWG-YT), at 10:00am on Sundays.

Sunday, January 7, 10:00 am — <u>Observance</u>: Feast of the Epiphany (observed); Sacrament of Christ's Table; All Ages Worship. <u>Scriptures</u>: Isaiah 60:1-6; Psalm 72; Ephesians 3:1-12; Matthew 2:1-12. On this day we remember Matthew's birth-of-Jesus story — the arrival of the Magi in Bethlehem, the revelation of Good News to all the world, and the revolution introduced in the person of a toddler Messiah. <u>Message of the Day</u>: "Was It Magic?"

SUNDAY, JANUARY 14, 10:00 AM — Observances: SECOND SUNDAY AFTER THE EPIPHANY; SUNDAY OF MLK HOLIDAY WEEKEND. Music: Chancel Choir performs with the Oîkos Jazz Ensemble. Liturgist: Joan Musbach. Scriptures: 1 Samuel 3:1-20; Psalm 139:1-6, 13-18; 1 Corinthians 6:12-20; John 1:43-51. This Sunday includes readings about the youngest Judge ever to be commissioned by God (Samuel) and probably the youngest of Jesus' disciples to be called (Philip and Nathanael). The latter tale ends with Jesus comparing himself to the Ladder in Jacob's dream (Genesis 28:10-17). The gospel reading becomes a foreshadowing of Jesus' explanation of himself in John 10 as a "gate" (compare John 10:7, 9 and Genesis 28:17). Message of the Day: "Jesus the Ladder"

Sunday, January 21, 10:00 am — Ecumenical Sunday (Week of Prayer for Christian Unity). <u>Music</u>: Canterbury Bells. <u>Liturgist</u>: Mark Edwards. The World Council of Churches and the Pontifical Council for Promoting Christian Unity Joint Commission on the Week of Prayer for Christian Unity has named the theme for the 2024 Week's observance: "You Shall Love!"

Luke 10:25-37 tells the story of how Jesus was asked by an expert in the Law, "What must I do to inherit everlasting life?" Jesus replied, "What is written in the Law?" The expert: "You shall love the Lord your God with all your heart, and with all your soul, and with all your strength, and with all your mind; and your neighbor as yourself." Then Jesus said, "You have given the right answer; do this, and you will live." The expert's further question, "And who is my neighbor?" led Jesus to tell the parable of the Good Samaritan.

On this Ecumenical Sunday, we pray for unity of purpose and message with our fellow Christians in proclaiming Good News, a message echoed in the calls for justice and righteousness from all the Abrahamic traditions.

Sunday, January 28, 10:00 am – Heritage Sunday (158th Anniversary); Health and Human Service Sunday (UCC). <u>Music</u>: Chancel Choir. <u>Liturgist</u>: Laurel Hayes. <u>Scriptures</u>: Psalm 111; Mark 1:21-28. Mark says that Jesus taught "as one with authority and not like the scribes." What exactly was meant by this, and how might we – who are often skeptical of traditional ways of interpreting and practicing faith – emulate this sort of ministry toward others? <u>Message of the Day</u>: "*Genuine Authority*"
