

During the Postlude, we encourage you to greet those around you, or to remain at your seat to enjoy the music until it has ended. In the spirit of diversity, please be attentive to the possibility that one who is seated may be meditating.

Cover art is a mural painted on the side of a thrift store in the Uptown neighborhood of Chicago. An accompanying panel says, "This racial reconciliation mural – designed by youth & adult artists of Uptown Baptist Church. More than 40 artists of all ages of this street, Uptown, & Chicago painted for the glory of God. First completed, 1995. Restored, 2001."

The cross image gracing the sanctuary vault is a depiction of the three basic strokes in Japanese *sumi-e* painting, representing physical reality (vertical), the passage of time (horizontal), and movement (circle). They closely resemble the Celtic cross in which the lines and circle are associated heaven (vertical), earth (horizontal), and eternity (circle). The intersection of these meanings, and the membership here of *sumi-e* painter Chiura Obata from 1943 to 1945, led planners of our 150th Jubilee in 2016 to commission this work. It was crafted by metal-worker Kem Williams and made possible by a grant from the Dr. Rodney M. Coe Memorial Fund.

Lent Devotional Study – "This Is My Body" After Worship (about 11:30am) during Lent and in Kids Church

The Pastor and the Coordinator of Faith Formation announce a devotional study for all ages during Lent, starting Sunday, February 18 and continuing through Palm Sunday, March 24. The devotional booklets, *This Is My Body* by Illustrated Ministry, are designed for home use (one for adults and the other for families) and group discussion. Participants will explore how Jesus lived in his body on earth and invite us to take care of – and embrace the goodness of – our own bodies.

Each week highlights a different story from Jesus' life and connects it to shared human experiences – like growing up, taking naps, or drinking water. By engaging with these stories through a broad lens of embodiment, *This Is My Body* seeks to inspire curiosity, wonder, and awe. Adult discussions will take place on Sundays during Coffee Fellowship; young people will talk about *This Is My Body* in Kids Church.

FROM THE PASTOR

This Is My Body

And the Word became flesh and dwelt among us...
full of grace and truth.
(John 1:14)

I am always brought to wonder at the heart of our religion – the Incarnation of the eternal God who so longed to know our human condition as to be born and dwell among us.

A new devotional guide by Illustrated Ministry, *This Is My Body*, explores the depth and breadth of the actual Atonement – which only partly includes the matter of Christ suffering and dying for the sins of the world. Crucially important for our understanding of who God is for us and with us, is that the Almighty

- became a baby,
- grew up, enduring adolescence and young adulthood,
- appears to have been occasionally sassy with his parents,
- required rest and food and drink,
- loved and forgave.

I encourage you to take part with others in this wonderful weekly study of Jesus' earthly life. You can participate in the way that you feel most apt to do. You can simply pick up a printed copy of the devotional, or you can download it (see the weekly *Covenant News* to find out how).

You can engage with others in a group discussion led by me on Sundays after worship. On Sundays when Kids Church is in session, Johari and Noel will use the weekly Family Edition to spark wondering and conversation with the young people.

Worship services during Lent will include prayers and other liturgy based on the devotional guide, too. This promises to be a meaningful season, as we look toward the Resurrection.

WORSHIP NOTES FOR FEBRUARY 2024

This schedule is subject to change, as need may arise.
All worship services noted below will be offered in person and live streamed (bit.ly/FCCWG-YT), at 10:00am on Sundays, except Ash Wednesday.

- **SUNDAY, FEBRUARY 4** *Fifth Sunday after the Epiphany; Sacrament of Christ's Table; All Ages Worship.* Scriptures: Isaiah 40:21-31; Psalm 147:1-11; Mark 1:29-39. As the season After the Epiphany draws to a close, we are reminded of the profound call to hospitality which is so central to the Abrahamic faiths. But it is not only important for us to understand how to "entertain strangers," as the author of the letter to the Hebrews insisted, but how to be a good guest. In an interactive sermon, Pastor Dave Denoon will prompt children and adults to think about how often Jesus was a guest in others' homes, and what it means to be invited to Christ's table. Message of the Day: "**Jesus the Guest**"
- Sunday, February 11 Transfiguration Sunday; Racial Justice Sunday; Evolution & Science Sunday; Scout Sunday 2 Kings 2:1-12; Psalm 50:1-6; 2 Corinthians 4:3-6; Mark 9:2-9. The final Sunday before Lent begins, we recall how it was that Jesus' true identity as God's Child was revealed to three disciples. Simon Peter, James, and John witnessed Jesus transfigured. Jesus told them to say nothing about it until after his resurrection. But what could they have said?! Pastor Dave Denoon offers his thoughts on what Progressive Christian evangelism can look like. Message of the Day: "What Do You Say?"
 - Prayers and other parts of the liturgy during the season of Lent will include the theme for each week in our Lenten study, *This Is My Body.* -
- **ASH WEDNESDAY, FEBRUARY 14, 7:00PM** in the Jubilee Garden with Sts. Clare & Francis Ecumenical Catholic Communion Psalm 90; Matthew 6:1-6, 16-21. This brief but meaningful service around an open fire will include the burning of last year's palms from Palm Sunday and the imposition of ashes. Afterward, enjoy hot chocolate together with other worshipers; it may seem a little out of character for the holy day, but the clergy hope that it may affirm our unity for the Lenten journey.
- **SUNDAY, FEBRUARY 18** *First Sunday in Lent* Psalm 25:1-10; 1 Peter 3:18-22; Mark 1:9-15. Our emphasis in worship, this morning, will be on the meaning of Christ's baptism and our own... and on how these events affirm God's oneness with us. Message of the Day: "We're in It with Him"
- SUNDAY, FEBRUARY 25 Second Sunday in Lent; Seminary Sunday; Church Vocations Sunday Psalm 22:25-31; Romans 4:13-25; Mark 8:31-38. We celebrate our historic relatedness with the UCC seminaries of the Midwest (Chicago, United in the Twin Cities, and Eden), collecting an offering to their benefit. The scriptures direct our attention to the faithfulness of Abraham and Sarah, and to the character of our faithfulness to Jesus taking up our crosses and following. What, the Pastor asks, might be possible with faith? Message of the Day: "Believing that Christ CAN"
