

### **Coordinator of Faith Formation April Report**



### **UGANDA WATER PROJECT**



For the last several months, Ugandans Peter Kalulu and Lawrence Katumba have been attending our church. They are completing their master's in public health from Washington University and will be finished in May.

60% of Uganda's rural population lacks access to clean, safe drinking water. Children and families are drinking, bathing, and washing clothes in polluted rivers, ponds and lakes. Families are at great risk for waterborne diseases. Lawrence and Peter have stepped forward with their Field for Humanity Uganda Water Project to give villages a way to establish a sustainable and cost effective means for clean water.

Under the direction of both Lawrence and Peter the Field for Humanity has provided for the construction costs, from the government rural water lines to the first kiosk built that provides safe drinking water to four villages. This benefits 375 households and over 2250 children and adults. In addition, five ceramic water filters and 25 Sato toilets have been installed.

Their goal is to construct additional community water kiosks, water filters and toilets across all 44 villages. The total cost of a kiosk filter and toilets is \$1,000. The team has the capability to construct 10 kiosks per year.

Our church members are a giving group. Lawrence and Peter's project has touched my heart because of my involvement with similar projects through Rotary.

I am undertaking the solicitation of church donations for Field for Humanity. Checks can be made payable to FCCWG with notation in the memo line "Uganda Water Project." Donations may be given from one's IRA directly to the church; contact your financial advisor.
