

PASTOR'S REPORT "Recovery Mode"

(Instead of my usual monthly "From the Pastor," this month I am submitting my 2024 annual report to you.)

Last year, I concluded my report with a section titled, "I am thankful and encouraged." I remain so, I look forward to the coming year(s), and I hope that you do too. For me, this is because, as I prepare for my second sabbatical, I find myself reflecting on the unexpected recovery we are experiencing and how it assures me that I can afford to step aside for a few months, to restore.

Think about this: In the twelve months just past we bade farewell to only two members by death and two by letter of transfer, while we've welcomed eleven new members and two members have renewed their memberships. How can one not be encouraged by such news!

I have a hunch about that, really. In 1977 – within living memory for many of us – First Church counted 1,430 "active" members, an active member being someone "who actively participates in the spiritual and financial life of the church" (Bylaws, Article I, Section 1, Paragraph A) and who is not affiliated with another congregation. We are now at one-tenth that number, or 143, not including associate members (individuals who *are* affiliated with another church – I count 17; the Membership Committee's number is closer to 30). Even as we recover from covid with the rest of the world and we feel a certain Spirit of life among us, there are some who remember 1977 and earlier. It might feel to some as if what I am identifying as a recovery mode is actually just a blip in an irreversible decline.

But something is definitely happening to the good, right now. And I choose to identify it as a renewal of our faith community. In this renewal, we find ourselves "on message." The electronic signboard promotes our congregation as Open and Affirming; a banner at the corner of Elm & Lockwood calls for "A Just World for All." I was recently presented a Citizen of the Year award by the area Chamber of Commerce for my work (with you!) to demand positive change and to correct historic and present-day wrongs. People are paying attention. Every Sunday, we welcome newcomers who have gotten word about us as a sanctuary for vulnerable people and who experience not only our warmth but our sense of purpose.

Yes, we show up for our wider community, and we are showing up for each other. I am not saying that previous generations of First Church members failed to do this, but often these were individual efforts. No such thing arises anymore. If a call goes out of a need among us or around us, Google Sheet signups are struck up and filled in! First Church is clearly a community in which each of us and all of us are seeking (and hopefully able) to do the most good we can. What's left is to be learning more about each other and to appreciate one another more fully. And I'm not just referring to Coffee Fellowship. Take other church members out for a favorite beverage, one-on-one. Tell each other stories about yourselves. Then, follow up and check in. Our community deserves disciples who are considering together what it means to be human and Christian and for one another.

What will the numbers in the Membership report tell us about ourselves, twelve months from now? How strongly will our recovery continue?

I am thankful and encouraged.
