TOLLING OF THE BELL

LIGHTING OF THE CANDLES

CALL TO WORSHIP based on Isaiah 6:1-8

(Responsive – <u>Liturgist</u>; <u>Minister</u>; <u>B</u>AND; <u>C</u>ongregation)

- L: In the year that King Uzziah died, I saw the Holy One sitting on a throne, high and exalted; and the trailing edges of God's garment filled the temple.
- M: Seraphs were attending God. Six wings! Each had six wings! With two they covered their faces, and with two they covered their midsection, and with two they flew.



# What's goes on at First Church during the week?

I would guess that many members are not aware of the wide variety of activities that take place in our building when they are not here. Did you know that you can train your dog, practice your watercolor skills and get a massage in our building? The following organizations have signed leases and use our building on a regular basis:

- Building C contains Memorial Hall. Saint Clare and Francis, a progressive Catholic Church worship every Saturday afternoon upstairs in Sample Chapel. During the week, Patterson Performing Arts utilize the classroom space that surrounds the chapel. Young students (and a few older ones) take voice and piano lessons. In Memorial Hall, there are two General Conditioning classes a week. In addition, the U. City Orchestra rehearses every week. Dog trainers take over the basement of Building C, with both day and evening classes. In the Dickens Room (west side of the basement), Alcoholics Anonymous meet every weekday at Noon. They are talking about expanding to an evening and morning sessions to accommodate additional folks.
- Building B is the "middle" building that contains The Kishlar and Inglis Rooms. Weekly users include Kirkwood Duplicate Bridge Club, AlAnon- a support group for family members of addicted individuals and two Oasis music group rehearsals. In addition, the St. Louis Watercolor Society use the space.
- The A building contains the sanctuary as well as older sections on the second and third floors.

  Dana Mullins runs a thriving Massage Therapy business in the old Bride's room. The St Louis Stamp

  Club meets in the Parlor. St Louis Vocal Project rehearses weekly on the third floor.

The above organizations use our space on a weekly/monthly basis. In addition, 10 West Lockwood brings income from a wide range of single time or annual events. Our Events Coordinator, Alicia McMinn has done a great job bringing in clients and keeping it all organized. Looking at her report from last month, her list includes a 50th birthday party, wedding, retirement party, music recital, family reunion, Trivia Nights, Drag Bingo, Medieval Festival and annual sales for Weavers Guild, WG Herb Society & Midwest Metalsmiths, All in all, quite a diverse group! # **Greetings from C.E.!**

Christian Education has had quite a productive year! As we began the program year, we were still in search of a Coordinator of Faith Formation. During our early months together, we searched, interviewed, and eventually recommended Johari Hunt for the position. We are so glad we did! He, along with Noel Burke have been developing and carrying out the curriculum (with the help of cherished volunteers) for our children's programming. Noel will now be joining us for more Sundays to help with staff consistency and planning.

In conjunction with the Communications Team and other ministries, we helped plan and facilitate the annual Vehicle Fair. It was, again, a great success! New attractions have been discussed for the fall of 2024. In October CE invited staff from Peace Church to present their housing project. As a new member of the Old Webster Trade Association, First Church took part in the Old Webster November Holiday Open House. We had great weather and a fantastic crowd. Families waited in line for a ride on Santa's helper train. Perhaps there will be more events with this group in the future.

In 2024 CE has planned several programs. Johari arranged a Town Hall meeting with youth, ages 13 - 19 in January. The annual Easter Egg Hunt in March was small but bountiful. After Lent, members enjoyed learning about the Uganda water project presented by Peter Kalulu and Lawrence Katumba. Other programs yet to come are Racially Restrictive Covenants with Samantha Enlund, Banned Books with Janet Mees and Narcan Training, arranged by Johari.
