#### **Assisted Listening Systems**

# Prospect Conversation: "Jesus Has Left the Building"

## TODAY at 11:20AM Memorial Hall

"Jesus Has Left the Building" is an outreach program conducted seasonally by churches across America. Worshipers arrive on a Sunday morning for prayer and singing, and then either stay at the church for an in-house project (e.g., preparing layettes for newborns or stuffing lunch sacks for a hunger ministry) or leave the building for an offsite project (e.g., yard cleanup or home improvement for underserved people). Projects would be expansive enough that anyone who wants to participate can, regardless of age or physical limitation. The Peace & Justice Team leads this discussion about whether "Jesus Has Left the Building" might be a prospect for our faith community.

#### **Get Out The Vote**

On Saturday October 26, Sunday October 28, Saturday November 2, and Sunday November 3, Churches Together for Justice will be canvassing and phone-banking to residents in and around Webster Groves to Get Out The Vote (GOTV). There is also an important training session for GOTV participants before the canvassing dates. Notably, there will be no promotion of any particular position on any race, Amendment, or Proposition; this effort is only to get out the vote. ## Please Opt-in to Texts with a "Yes"

On October 23, anyone who, in the last 30 days, has received a bulk text from the Church (from number 87447, with a message beginning "Breeze-fccwgstlmo:") will be receiving a text inviting them to consent to receive text messages in this way. Being able to contact you in this way makes it possible for the Church to send important alerts and reminders. (The last such message sent was a reminder about the Pet Blessing on Sept 29.) Wireless carriers now require that a double opt-in occur before any texts are sent through the Breeze platform. This means that a member must indicate (written or verbally) their desire to receive texts, as well as reply to an automated text with "Yes" before any texts can be sent. We hope you'll answer "Yes," this Wednesday.
