THE ORGAN IN A NEW LIGHT - Sunday, February 2, 2:30PM

In celebration of the 30th anniversary of the VerHagen Memorial sanctuary organ, organist John Powel Walsh will present a program entitled, "The Organ in a New Light." John's experience includes service as organist of the St. Louis Bach Society and the St. Louis Abbey.

His program on February 2 will include music "by composers who should have written more for the organ." This will include arrangements of familiar pieces by Copland, Verdi, Handel, Mozart, Sousa, and even more whose works would have sounded great played by a musician employing all four limbs at once!

Our sanctuary instrument was created by Casavant Frères organ builders of Montreal, Canada. Its purchase was made possible by a generous donation in 1994 from Jan & Katy VerHagen in loving memory of their son David.
