

Maundy Thursday, April 17, 7:00PM

Maundy Thursday was the night on which Jesus was betrayed. This was also when, at table for his Last Supper, Jesus blessed the bread and cup and characterized them as his body and his blood. The gospel according to John says that, in the midst of supper, he got up, prepared a basin, wrapped a towel around himself, and washed his disciples feet which for some reason had gone unwashed since they'd entered the building of the Upper Room. All of these actions will be remembered on Thursday, April 17 at 7:00PM in the newly renovated William E. Sample Chapel with Sts. Clare & Francis Ecumenical Catholic Communion.

Good Friday Blues, April 18, 7:00PM

This Friday we will conduct our annual Good Friday Blues program, led by Pastor Maggie Gann of Sts. Clare & Francis Church and Pastor Dave Denoon, with music by the Oîkos Jazz Ensemble and narration by the Logos Readers. This year's Good Friday Blues is entitled, **Resistance**. Together, we'll reflect on the resistance to his ministry Jesus faced, from his temptations in the wilderness, to his anointing by Mary of Bethany. These are not unlike the challenges we face to the purpose and practice of our work on behalf of the most vulnerable in our society.
