

An Apology regarding our Livestream Challenges

If you have tried to view our livestream of worship on Sunday mornings at 10AM on YouTube (or any other real time transmission from the sanctuary), you almost certainly have noticed that the presentation is filled with buffering and glitchiness. This seems to have coincided with a change in our internet service provider (ISP). We changed our ISP because, although the prior one provided us with a great connection, their billing was inconsistent in terms of price and required a lot of office time in protesting and negotiating. The new ISP promised that they would provide similar service and the same upload and download speeds, but this has not been the case.

We regret the difficulty, recognize the importance of correcting the problem, and are trying to work with the ISP to remedy the inconvenience. We appreciate your patience and encourage you, if watching a recording of worship might be acceptable, to wait for the uploaded version of worship to appear on our Videos tab (rather than the Live tab).
